The 100th Anniversary of JSCE in 2014

♦ Greetings from the 100th Anniversary Planning Committe (Prof. Yozo Fujino, Ph.D., Chair)

Civil Engineering which is a central part of "engineering" became independent of The Japan Federation of Engineering Society on 24th November, 1914 as the Japan Society of Civil Engineers (JSCE) after other engineering such as electrical engineering, mechanical engineering and architectural engineering had been independent. JSCE will have taken the 100th anniversary of its founding in 2014.

Japan experienced significant changes in the last 100 years. In the last 20 years, especially, environment around Japan and social needs demanded of civil engineering were changing rapidly. Then there are so many challenges such as population decline and aging population, globalization, deterioration of economic situation, exhaustion in countryside, increase of maintenance and operation cost

on infrastructure, frequent disaster, problems of resource, energy and global environment and so on. It is responsibility for civil engineering to keep long-term and comprehensive vision, to meet the social needs with viewing changes of the time and to keep working hard in order to seek increase of public benefit. And in addition to advance individual technique, activity and spirit which contributes to human life and work as well as symbiosis between human being and nature with putting in synthesis are permanence since founding of the Society.

ACECC 24th Executive Council Meeting (ECM) was held in Taipei, Taiwan on February 22 and 23. 51 representatives from American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE), Chinese Institute of Civil and Hydraulic Engineering (CICHE), Engineers Australia (EA), the Indonesian Society of Civil and Structural Engineers (HAKI), The Institution of Civil Engineers, India (ICE, India), Korean Society of Civil Engineers (KSCE), , the Philippine Institute of Civil Engineers (PICE) and JSCE sent their delegates attended the meeting.

The ECM focused on the ACECC Awards and the 6th Civil Engineering Conference in the Asia Region (CECAR6) which is held in Jakarta in August this year. President's Mumbling

Japanese infrastructure sustainability

In the morning of December 2nd 2012, about 130m concrete ceiling boards of Japanese Central Highway Sasago Tunnel bound for Tokyo at Yamanashi prefecture collapsed. 9 people died and 2 people injured by this accident. This accident is one of the most serious accidents in the history of Japanese highways. Each ceiling board is 5m of length, 1.2m of width, 8 or 9cm of thickness, and about 1.2 or 1.4t of weight. The boards were the part of the ventilation duct and set by anchors to the top of the tunnel. The causes of this accident are now under investigation.

In response to this accident, we JSCE started the taskforce to consider the issue of Japanese social foundations' sustainability on December 21st 2012. Since Japanese social foundations were abruptly constructed during the years from 1955 to 1973, most of them have become older and deteriorated to be reportedand their structural problems have been reported. Although social foundations are the bases of our lives and social/economic activities, their durability depends on the adequacy of maintenance. Therefore, inadequately maintained social foundation finally causes the serious problems for our society. On the other hand, we have problems of not enough engineers with specific technologies, inadequate management systems, and less budget.

Our taskforce is going to discuss the technology development, engineers' education, management method, and improvement of administrative systems including budget through the co-operation of specialists in various fields. We also utilize the information of the committees that investigate into and discuss about the social foundations' maintenance; one of which is sponsored by the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism, and the other is sponsored by the Japan Federation of Construction Contractors. Our target is not only to propose realistic strategies for the maintenance of social foundations to the administrators but also to

support putting into them practice.
Staff's Mumbling
It has been still chilly, but doesn't stop cherry trees from flowering. Last week we received a visit from H.E. U Lwing the Minster of Construction and his colleagues, which was on a cold day. Considering the weather back home, we were afraid that they must have felt even colder than we did. We are planning to hold a joint symposium with MES in Myanmar at the beginning of May, which we will experience the heat that they feel daily. We will learn their way of thinking and perspectives, experiencing the environments that they live in, and so will they. Then, we will figure out a "good cooperation between the two societies, and between two countries. (Y)
